



About Dormitory Life

International students live in dormitories located on the school premises, just a minute's walk from the school. Meals are provided three times a day in the dining hall attached to the dormitory. Students are responsible for their own housekeeping and laundry, which helps them develop independence. Additionally, the living arrangements are shared with Japanese students, which facilitates the acquisition of the Japanese language. From Monday to Thursday, there is a one-hour study session held from 19:00 to 20:00, which helps students develop good study habits.

On weekends, students are free to go out, use the dormitory kitchen to cook, or spend their free time as they wish. If they are interested, they can also participate in various volunteer activities to interact with local community members. During the long breaks in spring, summer, and winter, it is also possible for students to return to their home countries.

Living in the dormitory provides numerous opportunities to experience Japanese culture and acquire the social skills necessary for life in Japan. Furthermore, living together helps students establish a regular routine and strengthens the bonds with their peers.

Regular Course

Sports and Wellness Course

The Sports and Wellness course, newly introduced in 2024, requires students to participate in one of the following extracurricular activities: baseball, soccer, track and field, volleyball. In this course, students learn to accurately understand their abilities and individuality while measuring their physical performance. Additionally, they aim to enhance their foundational fitness and improve their skills to maximize their potential.

Furthermore, through an educational exchange agreement with Shizuoka Sangyo University, students can study specialized topics related to sports psychology and health. By exploring sports from various angles, they can determine their future paths. This course primarily prepares students for careers such as professional athletes or admission to universities with sports science programs and medical vocational schools. It’s an excellent course for students interested in sports and health!



Second-Year Students and Third-Year Students

Special Advanced Course

You will select between a science course and a humanities course starting in your second year. You take courses that will aid you in your future endeavors.

We also train you essay writing and presentation techniques, which are critical for university admission. Our mission is to get you ready for admission to public or private universities.



International Culture Course

Most international students choose this course.

Our main emphasis in this course is learning English. You'll practice it for university entrance examinations and deliver presentations in English. The objective is to enroll in a Japanese university.

It is possible for overseas students to sit for exams required by their home universities.



Global Career Course

As part of our community collaboration activities, we are involved engage in various projects. We interview local companies and share our findings through blogs and other platforms. Additionally, we collaborate with local businesses to grow sesame seeds.

Through these diverse experiences, we identify local challenges and explore ideas for problem-solving. After graduation, students can choose from a variety of paths, including employment or pursuing higher education.



Japanese Language Education

You can learn the fundamentals of reading and writing in addition to everyday conversation from skilled Japanese instructors. Your life becomes more enjoyable and you have



more opportunities to pursue higher education or employment as your proficiency in Japanese increases. Our goal is for you to pass the N1, the highest level of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test, by the time you graduate.

Lunch

You eat a meal provided in the cafeteria for lunch. A balanced diet is taken into consideration when creating the meals. A popular dish on the menu is curry rice. Every two months, there is an event called "WORLD FESTA" wherein the cuisines of our international students' home countries are served. Dishes from Germany, Korea, Vietnam, and the Philippines have been served so far.
